The start of the day

sensory area thanks to a joint bid by the governors and FOPS. We have purchased 6 'off road' go karts to use on a race course we are building using tyres sourced by the Waldron family. We are also planning to build a stone Gothic folly with the funds raised by FOPS. This is not part of our Saturday work!

We have been able recently to build upon our library stock to help promote reading. Thank you to Mrs Murphy for all her work in this.

Clearly all of this does cost money but thanks to the work of staff and governors who have made prudent and careful financial decisions we are still able to make these investments in your children's education. Especially when supported by our fabulous FOPS team.
